DAIRY CATTLE RULES:

1. Present health papers before unloading.
2. All animals entered may be purebred or grade.
3. Animals must be owned by May 1, 2008 and must be under exhibitor's care.
4. Only blue ribbon winners are eligible for champion rosettes and trophies.
5. Premiums will be awarded as follows:
Blue - \$7.00, Red - \$5.00, White - \$3.00
6. Entry fee per animal is \$5.00.

The Bucket Calf Show will be open to 8-12 year old 4-H members in good standing, currently enrolled in the Bucket Calf Project or Exploring. Monroe County only.

RULES:

1. Calf must be born from February 1, 2008 to May 15, 2008.
2. Calf must be owned and hand-fed by project member since it was two (2) weeks old.
3. Calf may be any breed or sex (heifer, steer or bull).
4. Calf is not eligible to be shown in other classes (beef/dairy).
5. Calf should be broken to lead and be shown by proper method according to breed (beef or dairy).
6. Classes will be divided by exhibitor's age if necessary.
7. Criteria for judging:
25% - Showmanship
25% - Condition, Health and Grooming of calf
20% - Quality of calf (Structural, Soundness, etc.)
30% - Knowledge Gained (Judge will talk with exhibitor.)
A. Breed B. Age C. Feeding Practices D. Growth Changes (measurements of height and chest circumferences and/or weight.)
E. Medicines (Vaccinations, Worming, Etc.)
8. Each member is limited to no more than 1 calf.

The Junior Beef Cattle Show will be open to 4-H & FFA members in good standing currently enrolled in the Beef Cattle Project.

BREEDING ANIMALS RULES:

1. A \$7.00 entry fee per animal will be collected at the time of entry.
2. Prize money will be awarded according to the following scale: Blue - \$10.00, Red - \$7.00, White - \$5.00.
3. All purebred breeding animals must have registration papers that are recorded in the Junior exhibitor's name. The ownership date must be April 1 or before.
4. All breeding stock must be in place by 2:00 p.m. on July 22.
5. Each exhibitor is limited to two entries per class.
6. Exhibitors must accompany their animals to the show, care for them and exhibit them unless given prior approval.
7. Exhibitors with more than one animal in class may be assisted by another youth 4-H or FFA member.
8. All breeding stock that do not qualify for a purebred class listed below will show in the commercial class, the committee having the right to add or drop classes.
9. All classes will show for Supreme Heifer, except cow/calf winner.

Junior Heifer Calf: (Calved between Jan. 1 and July 18, 2008)

Senior Heifer Calf: (Calved between Sept. 1 and Dec. 31, 2007)

Summer Yearling Heifer: (Calved between May 1 and Aug. 31, 2007)

Late Jr. Yearling Heifer: (Calved between Mar. 1 and Apr. 30, 2007)

Early Jr. Yearling Heifer: (Calved between Jan. 1 and Feb. 28, 2007)

Senior Yearling Heifer: (Calved between Sept. 1 and Dec. 31, 2006)

Cow and Calf: (Any female with calf shown at side)

BULL CLASSES

Junior Bull Calf: (Calved after Jan. 1, 2008)

Senior Bull Calf: (Calved between Sept. 1 and Dec. 31, 2007)

Summer Yearling Bull: (Calved between May 1 and Aug. 31, 2007)

Junior Yearling Bull: (Calved between Jan. 1 and Apr. 30, 2007)

All Beef Cattle Exhibitors need to be in place at 2:00 p.m. Steer weigh-in will begin at 2:30 p.m. or immediately after the Exhibitor Meeting.

JUNIOR BEEF STEER SHOW

Tuesday, July 22, 2008 – Following Breeding Show

Performance Class: Rate of Gain

Limited to Monroe County 4-H and FFA Members only.

Awards based on steers' average daily gains in a given feed period. Must have weighed in early spring to qualify to show in the Average Daily Gain Contest.

Prize: First - \$10.00, Second - \$7.50, Third - \$5.00, Fourth - \$2.50

MARKET STEER CLASSES

Class - Market Steer

Rules: All Monroe County steers must be weighed at spring weigh day to be shown at the fair and sell at sale on July 24.

1. Steers will be divided into classes for show by their weight.
2. A \$7.00 entry fee will be collected per animal.
3. Premium money will be awarded on the basis of the following system: Blue - \$10.00, Red - \$7.00, White - \$5.00
4. All steers must be in place by 2:00 p.m. on Tuesday, July 22, 2008
5. All steers must be born after Jan. 1, 2007, and not have a broken mouth.
6. If any questions arise as to ownership or health, the state regulations will be followed.
7. **Exhibitors must accompany their animals to the show, care for them, and exhibit them unless given prior approval.**
8. Exhibitors with more than one animal in class may be assisted by another youth 4-H or FFA member.
9. Monroe County steers will be required to wear ear tags to show.

Home Raised Monroe County Steer: Animals in this category must be offspring of a female owned by exhibitor or exhibitor's parents or exhibitor's guardian and must have been continuously owned by exhibitor or exhibitor's parents or guardian from birth until show time.

Monroe County Beef Show Exhibitors will be color coded by age with a cardstock number that will be worn on the person of the exhibitor in order to identify those eligible for Showmanship Awards. The Showmanship Award winners will be judged during the actual judging classes and named at the end of the evening. There will be no individual showmanship classes at the end of the steer show beginning with the 2005 Monroe County Fair.

Grooming, Showmanship and Herdsman Classes are open to Monroe County 4-H and FFA only.

Those showing steers will register steers at the check-in table, receive placing card and pay - then take steers to weigh. If showing breeding stock, also register all stock then pay. Money will be taken at check-in table by Grandstand only! Tattoos may be checked at the discretion of the committee.

HEREFORD PROMOTION

A \$2500.00 JACKPOT

will be offered to the owner of a registered Hereford Steer or registered Hereford Heifer that is Grand Champion of all breeds. If both win at the same time, they will split the \$2,500.00 pot. Pedigrees are required. Only reciprocating county exhibitors are eligible.
