The Rabbit Show will be open to 4-H and FFA members in good standing currently enrolled in the rabbit project or Exploring projects statewide.

RULES:

1. Rabbits must be owned by June 1, 2008. Meat Pen must be owned 5-10 weeks prior to show.
2. All animals will be inspected by show superintendent prior to show. Any diseased or sick rabbits will be dismissed from the show.
3. Exhibitors must bring their own cages to keep rabbits in.
4. Limit 2 entries per class per exhibitor. - Pen fee \$2.00.
5. Rabbits will be judged according to breed standards of American Rabbit Breeders Association.
6. Premiums will be awarded as follows: Blue - \$3.00, Red - \$2.00, White - \$1.00.
7. Exhibitor must handle and bring their own rabbit to the table or may have help from another 4-H or FFA member. Absolutely no parent or adult can help.
8. All rabbits must be permanently tattooed.
9. Exhibitors must accompany their animals to the show, care for them, and exhibit them unless given prior approval.
10. Health regulations will be strictly enforced. See rules on page 23.

3. Must have ownership and care of poultry at least two (2) months prior to show.
4. In each class bantams will be judged separately from standards. Then the top bantam and top standard from each class will be judged for the trophy in that class.
5. Exhibitors must accompany their animals to the show, care for them and exhibit them unless given prior approval.
6. Health regulations will be strictly enforced. See rules on page 13.
7. Premium will be awarded as follows:

The Dairy Goat Show will be open to 4-H and FFA members in good standing enrolled in the Dairy Goat Project or Exploring statewide.

RULES AND REGULATIONS:

1. All dairy goats must be owned 2 months prior to show.
2. Each exhibitor will be limited to two entries in each class.
3. Exhibitors must accompany their animals to the show, care for them and exhibit them, unless given prior approval.
4. Exhibitors with more than one animal in a class may be assisted by another junior member.
5. A \$3.00 stall fee for each animal will be collected.
6. All purebreds must show proof of ownership; i.e. registration all purebreds, and recorded grades must be tattooed and must be healed. Dairy Goats may be any dairy breed or crossbred.
7. Health requirements are listed this book and will be strictly followed.
8. Every goat must be properly fitted for show, and be provided with a collar. All exhibitors must be neatly dressed and must wear white while in the show ring.
9. All milk must be disposed of properly in designated areas. No dumping of milk will be allowed in any drain or on the ground.
10. Premium money will be as follows:
Blue - \$5.00, Red - \$3.00, White - \$1.00
11. Over extended udders will be discriminated against.
12. Exhibitors may not leave until show is over.

The Meat Goat Show will be open to 4-H Members and FFA Members in good standing currently enrolled in Goat project or Exploring statewide.

RULES

1. Rules that apply at the State Fair will apply at this show. Breeding animals must be owned by June 1, 2008.
2. No arrivals before 12:00 p.m. All goats must be in place by 3:00 p.m.
3. Market goats weigh in (goats must be slick sheared before weighing).
4. Market goats/breeding stock goats may be of any meat breed or crossbred.
5. Does may be shown in Market class. Does shown in market class may not show in breeding class.
6. Each exhibitor will be limited to two entries per class.
7. Animals exhibited must be on all four feet at all times.
8. No slapping.
9. Exhibitors must accompany their animals to the show, care for them and exhibit them unless given prior approval.
10. Premium money will be as follows:
Blue - \$5.00, Red - \$3.00, White - \$1.00
11. A \$3.00 stall fee for each animal will be collected.
12. Health papers in the exhibitor's name are required. Health regulations will be strictly enforced. See page 13.
13. No registration or recordation paper will be required for goats.
14. All market goats must be ear tagged, tattooed, or wearing a hanging neck tag for identification.
15. Exhibitors may not leave or load until show conclusion.
16. Showmanship & Herdsman classes are open to all exhibitors.
17. The Superintendent or Judge may excuse any exhibitor at any time if abuse or poor sportsmanship is shown.
