The Swine Show will be open to 4-H and FFA members in good standing currently enrolled in the Swine Project or Exploring statewide.

RULES

- Each exhibitor is limited to two entries per individual class. A \$3.00 stall fee will be collected per animal.
- Exhibitors must accompany their animals to the show, care for them, exhibit them and stay with them, unless given prior approval.**
- Exhibitors with more than one animal in class may be assisted by another youth member.
- The age span for purebred gilts is December 1, 2007 to March 31, 2008 and boars is January 1 to March 31, 2008.
- All gilts and boars in the **purebred classes must be registered.** Registration in the exhibitor's name and owned 90 days prior to the show.
- Purebred gilts and boars not eligible for registry will be shown in Commercial Class. All crossbred gilts will show by weight.
- All hogs must be in place by 8:30 A.M. on Thursday, July 24.
- All barrows will be weighed for the market class and divided into appropriate class. Barrows must be farrowed after Jan. 1.
- Health regulations will be strictly enforced. See rules on page 23.
- Premium money will be as follows:
Blue - \$4.00, Red - \$3.00, White - \$2.00.
Each animal receives premium once, including home raised.
- Swine Showmanship and Herdsmanship is limited to Monroe County 4-H exhibitors only, except for the adult class.
- Exhibitors may not leave until show is over and exhibitor card is signed by committee member.
- No oil or powder enhancements.
- PQA status will be checked on Show Day.

- Entrants must provide their own outfit but need not be handmade.
- Each entrant will be required to furnish a written description of their entire outfit. Description will be turned into the event chair by 5:00 p.m. It should be no more than 1/2 page. In addition, they should give their name, age, school, and a short resume of activities they are involved in.
- This event is open to both sexes.
- Exhibitor need not own the sheep that is shown in this class.
- Competition for 13 and under and 14 and over classes will be open to all members in good standing enrolled in 4-H or FFA.
- Competitors will be judged according to:
25% Coordination of outfit & accessories
25% Appropriateness for wearer
25% Originality, adaptability, practicality
25% Handling of sheep
- Pee Wee Class will be non-competitive with prizes for all participants. Those eligible for Pee Wee Class are ages 7 and under and open to the public.
